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Sacramental Programme:

An exciting new initiative is being introduced by Father Vaughan. He asked the schools if we could all work together to create this programme for 2020 and it is my pleasure to say that St Mary's, St Marcellin, Cullinaine College and ourselves will all be running a piece of each programme for all students across Wanganui. St Mary's is going to do Reconciliation, St Marcellin is doing First Holy Communion and Cullinaine and St Annes will be doing Confirmation. A baptism program will not be run this year, but this will be done in each school separately in early 2021. Please encourage your children and the wider community to feel they can be part of this.
